



ENSEMBLE SPOTLIGHT MILL POND CHAMBER CHORUS





The Mill Pond Chamber Chorus is an after school chamber chorus open to 5th and 6th grade chorus members. The Chamber Chorus has been meeting since January of 2014, shortly after Ms. Ehrenreich began teaching at the Mill Pond School. She realized fairly quickly that the chorus students really loved singing and wanted more opportunities to spread their joy of making music. Thus, the Mill Pond Chamber Chorus was founded.

It is an auditioned group of 35-40 5th and 6th students who perform at school functions such as "Across America Day", "UN Summit", Memorial Day Assemblies and the Spring Choral Concert to name a few. The members of the chorus enjoy sharing their love of singing and participating in these co-curricular Mill Pond events.

Auditions for the chorus take place in January. At the auditions, students sing a song individually for Ms. Ehrenreich, along with a few vocal exercises. Once auditions are completed, the chamber chorus is selected and rehearsals begin shortly thereafter. The chamber chorus meets after school on Wednesdays from 2:00-3:00pm through the end of the school year.





AVA BIANCHERI









- Guest clinician, Michele Adams, from the Performing Arts Center of Metrowest, worked with the three academic choir ensembles at WHS on February 16th and March 16th.
- Guest clinician, Michael Keough, from King Philip Regional HS, worked with the GMS Concert & Jazz bands on March 17th.

Teacher Grants:

In addition, WFAEA has been proud to offer grants to fine arts faculty to support innovative projects and initiatives. Here are a few examples of the teacher grants we recently funded:

- Gelli Printing Plates for Mill Pond: WFAEA awarded funds to Mill Pond Art Teacher, Amy Crossin, to facilitate the introduction of Gelli Printing Plates at Mill Pond, providing students with a unique and creative artistic medium.
- Armstrong Beat Tables: WFAEA awarded funds to support the acquisition of Armstrong beat tables, promoting rhythm and music education at its finest.
- Fales Instrument Stand and Mallets: WFAEA awarded funds for Fales School to purchase this needed equipment.

Supporting Community Projects:

WFAEA has also recently made a \$200 donation to Project Graduation as well as funding of transportation for Center Stage students to attend a performance of "Evita" at the prestigious American Repertory Theater.
